## JUNE 2010 TO JUNE 2011

Department Commander was Dick Perry. Post Commander was Rod Green. Color Guard Commander was Ed Mangan with Emil Jansky as his Assistant. The Color Guard presented Colors or other patriotic programs at: ARC; Akimel Middle School; Hawthorne Court Sr. Housing; Marcos de Niza High School; Pearl Harbor Day commemoration at Wesley Bolin Plaza; Centennial Middle School; an AZ Rattlers' game; the Rotary Club; and the Post Golf Tournament. The Honor Guard attended funerals or memorial services for Joe LeChaix and Matt Miller.

On July 3, 2010, the Color Guard opened the fireworks for the Ahwatukee Red, White, and Boom at Ahwatukee Country Club. They donated $\$ 300$ to the fireworks.

The USO took over the military and veteran lounge at Sky Harbor Airport and moved it to Terminal 4. Post 64 donated $\$ 250$. Other donations that year went to: YOPAS \$100; United Food Bank \$120; American Legion Baseball \$100; Mary Ellen's Place \$105 (for female veterans); AZ Veterans Stand Down \$250; American Legion Auxiliary VA Hospital Christmas Gift Shop \$179; Support the Troops Club at ARC \$250; and Girls Scout Cookie "Sweets to our Troops" \$50.

Post 64 was incorporated with the State of Arizona on September 20, 2010. Their official incorporation publications appeared the first week of January 2011. They applied for and received their Supplemental Charter from National and a new EIN to reflect their incorporated status.

They continued to volunteer with the South Mountain 620 trail project.
136 packages were sent to deployed service members in November 2010, and 125 packages in April 2011.
December 4, 2010, was the catered Holiday party. The POW/MIA table ceremony was performed by the JROTC from Desert Ridge High School in Gilbert. Christmas gifts were purchased for a family of 5 in south Phoenix, along with paying the family's outstanding bill with Southwest Gas. A tree was set up by the Post at the VA Hospital in Phoenix for the first time. The Post has continued to set up a tree every year since then.

In March 2011, Post 64 purchased their electronic ceremonial bugle.
April 1, 2011, was Patriotic Day at Akimel Middle School. The essay contest winners were 6th grade: Maya Williams (first place) and Mya Carrizosa, Josh Ridgeway, and Jacqui Williams (all honorable mention); 7th grade: Veronica Gasparro (first place) and Rylee Franks, Jenna Waterkotte, and Erica Richardson (all honorable mention); and 8th grade: Tayler Pyper (first place) and Albert Wang, Brian Ingersoll, and Jacobus Schieke (all honorable mention). This year's topic was, "How can I encourage my friends to show pride in being an American?"

April 9, 2011, was the third annual Post 64 golf tournament, however, the venue was changed to the Ahwatukee Country Club.

April 23, 2001, was the Easter Parade, hot dog picnic, and jazz band concert.
Mary 30, 2011, the Color Guard marched in the Parade of Colors and presented a wreath at the AZ National Cemetery. For the first time, the entire Post 64 delegation to the national cemetery stopped at Post 107 for Poppy Brunch following the ceremony.

June 14, 2011, there was a flag retirement program in the ARC parking lot.
Boys State citizens sponsored by Post 64 were Joseph Kim from Desert Vista High School, and Grady Bensted and Daniel Nyx from Mountain Pointe High School.

School Awards were presented to Xavier Balderamma and Madelyn Guyton (Centennial Middle School), Jacobus Schieke and Alexa Ryder (Akimel Middle School), and Michael Solomentsev and Aolfe Malone (Altadena Middle School). School Awards and $\$ 100$ scholarships were presented to Jacob Sciacca and Adrianna Preston (Mountain Pointe High School) and Dale Nicholls and Samantha Jaskolski (Desert Vista High School).

Department Convention was June 23-26, 2011, at the Carefree Resort. The membership goal for the year was 154 but was not attained. The highest number recorded was 145.

## JUNE 2011 TO JUNE 2012

Department Commander was George Cushing. Post Commander was Rod Green. Color Guard Commander was Ed Mangan, and his Assistant was Emil Jansky. The Color Guard presented Colors or other patriotic programs at: ARC; Department Oratorical Contest; the Ahwatukee Bowl on September 9, 2011, (Mountain Pointe vs. Desert Vista in football); Carl Hayden High School; Akimel Middle School; Williams Field High School (Veterans Day); DAR; Marcos de Niza High School; Kiwanis/Lions/Rotary Recognition Dinner; a separate Lion's Club meeting; the Post Golf Tournament; and Dobson Ranch Community Center. The Honor Guard attended funerals or memorial services for George Gulliford, Bob Roe, and Dale Morgan.

On July 3, 2011, the Post had a booth at the Red, White, and Boom Carnival at Ahwatukee Country Club and presented Colors before the start of the fireworks. Members helped with the Independence Day festivities at ARC.

The Post purchased wooden plaques of the emblems of the 5 major military branches to display at meetings and other events.

On November 11, 2011, members attended the dedication of the new AZ State Veterans Home in Tucson.

On March 3, 2012, the Department Oratorical Contest was hosted at ARC by Post 64 for the first time.
On March 24, 2012, the Post took part in the dedication of the Blue Star Memorial in Ahwatukee Park at 48th St. and Warner Rd. They purchased two pavers for the memorial: one engraved with American Legion Post 64 and the second with the ARC Veterans Club. The Desert Foothills Garden Club had been the organizing group behind the memorial, and had given presentations at several Post meetings during the year.

March 30, 2012, was Patriotic Day at Akimel Middle School. Essay contest winners were 6th grade: Rebecca Rockmaker (first place) and Adrianna Todd, Caleb Redshaw, and Louisa Mulderrig (all honorable mention); 7th grade: Nicole Trujillo (first place) and Anamaria Romero, Michaella Hernandez, and Matthew Martinez (all honorable mention); and 8th grade: Shiane Morrison (first place) and Kaylar Moser, Hunter LaRavia, and Skye Lindholme (all honorable mention). The topic was "How do I show patriotism in my community?"

March 31, 2012, was the 4th annual Post 64 golf tournament at Ahwatukee Country Club with 95 players.
April 7, 2012, was the annual Easter Parade, hot dog picnic, and jazz band concert.
That spring, the Post 64 website at americanlegionpost64.com went live thanks to Jim Woods.
Boys State citizens sponsored by Post 64 from Mountain Pointe High School were Avi Dasgupta and Andrew Argaez. Andrew went on to attend Boys Nation.

School Awards were presented to Kelly Molera and Samariah Riggins (Centennial Middle School), Kaylar Moser and Kenneth Moser (Akimel Middle School), and Mara Kemmer and Adrian Perez (Altadena Middle School). School Awards and \$100 scholarships were presented to Garrett Gaughan and Taylor Trujillo (Mountain Pointe High School) and Kathryn Boyle and Sterling Boyns (Desert Vista High School).

June 14, 2012, a flag retirement ceremony was held in the ARC parking lot.
Department Convention was at the Carefree Resort from June 21-24, 2012. Membership ended the year at 148 of 146 (101.4\%).
